

- Receive contributions for the purpose of funding grants to NRMSS;

- Use and apply funds to purchase educational materials and other necessary educational tools and equipment; stimulate, encourage, promote and enhance the educational enrichment and to expand the creative horizons of students through their active participation in the activities of this Corporation;
- Create, form and establish community based programs to support, improve, enrich and advance the educational development of school children;
- ❖ Assist children to participate meaningfully in the educational mainstream;
- Receive, establish and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property or both, and subject to any restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the income and principal thereof exclusively for the educational purposes of the foundation and generally to endeavor to support, further and advance the educational development of the students of NRMSS. Nothing herein shall authorize the corporation to operate or maintain a charter school, a nursery school, an elementary school, a secondary school, a college, university or to advertise or offer credit bearing courses or degrees in New York State.
- To receive, establish, and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and subject to any restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and principal thereof exclusively for charitable, scientific, and benevolent purposes either directly or by funding programs or projects that accomplish such charitable and benevolent purposes;
- Collaborate with the existing Alumni Chapter in Guyana regarding the needs of the students of NRSS;
- Help assure the stability of NRMSS as they contribute to academic excellence in Guyana;
- Associate with any non-profit organization involved in assisting Guyanese in Guyana and elsewhere;
- Formally associate with the NRMSS Old Students Association or any Successor Organization.

The US chapter fulfilled its goal to ensure NRMSS was equipped with 2 heavy duty printers needed to enable the school to provide letters, copy exams papers, create certificates etc. The US chapter encouraged the Canadian chapter to purchase one of the printers, and the US chapter purchased an efficient Laser Printer/Copier for the school that included a 3 year warranty. The warranty ensured repairs would be done at no cost. The Guyana Chapter promised to ensure toner and copy paper will be provided when necessary.

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Proposed Plans for 2018

US Chapter of NRMSS Alumni Committee decided to award book scholarships to eligible graduating students in the US of Guyanese Parentage and affiliations, in order to be compliant with requirement of 501C3's. Students must submit essays, and a panel made up of Alums and Committee members will vote on winners. Awards will be handed out at an event to be finalized.

We are thinking about hosting a mentorship program for the students of NRMSS in Georgetown either during the latter part of 2018 or in 2019. We are targeting the 4th formers. The plan is to help them decide and prepare them for the next steps after graduating.

We received a list form the head teacher of items needed at NRMS. The school is asking for projectors for the Science Department. We will get estimates for the projectors that are needed for the school.

The newly built Allied Arts department is an oven. In September of 2017, the students literally begged us to install Ceiling fans. Observations made, determined the fans would only be circulating hot air. Samuel John visited NRMS, and confirmed the students' complaints. He has building contractors, who will do a feasibility study and provide us an estimate. We plan to

compare the estimates with a few others, with the aim to try to install some method of ventilation, be it an A/C unit or cut out actual vents in the roof of the building.

We are considering hosting a Holiday Party. Perhaps a Boxing Day night or a New Year's Year Eve party and possibly revamping our bus rides as supplemental fundraisers.

Planning to form a fund raising committee and other ad hoc committees made up of persons who always help at NRMSS functions, but do not wish to be executive members.

NRMSS needs sports equipment for the Physical Education Department, and uniforms for the various teams. They are currently using uniforms left over from other Guyana sports teams.
